



Growing up the oldest of three boys in an NBA household following in my fathers footsteps there was no shortage of lessons to be learned. As a point guard, I've been an extension of the coach my entire life. My father Larry Drew Sr. played 10 years in the NBA and has logged 33 years as an NBA coach. He instilled in me key insight on how to be a professional early on, and with this passing of knowledge I was able to carve out my own path using basketball.

As an a McDonalds All American in high school I won the John R Wooden High School Player of the Year Award in 2008. I went on to win a national championship in 2009 with the North Carolina Tar Heels before transferring to UCLA in 2011. In my one season at UCLA playing for the Bruins I broke the single-season school record for assists and was also named to the All Pac 12 first team. Later, I went on to play professionally having spent two seasons in the NBA with the 76ers in 2015 and the Pelicans in 2018, two seasons overseas in France and Lithuania, two seasons in the G-League where I still hold the single game record for assists, and also participated with the US national team at the FIBA AmeriCup in 2017 where I won a gold medal and helped the US place in the 2020 Olympics.

Now at this stage of my career i'm looking to re-join the NBA family, bringing my wealth of basketball experience and knowledge accumulated over the course of 34 years to an NBA organization for the coming 2024-2025 season in any of the following roles, but not limited to:

- Coaching
- Player Development
- Scouting

I'm willing to put in the time, work and communication to get to know the players, their tendencies and the overall philosophy of the head coach and the team to maximize development in every area. From the break down of film to extra time spent after practice or on off days, being the first in the gym and the last to leave yields results. If I'm hired, this organization would be gaining an invaluable asset in somebody who understands the importance of hard work, team work, individual and team skill development, and what it takes to elevate ones game.
